Kim Jong Un also announced to the Supreme People's Assembly that the constitution should be changed such that South Korea would be considered the “primary foe and invariable principal enemy” of North Korea. Additionally, government agencies tasked with promoting reunification were closed.

Does North Korea have a government?

North Korea, like its southern counterpart, claims to be the sole legitimate government of the entire peninsula and adjacent islands. Pyongyang is the capital and largest city. The Korean Peninsula was first inhabited as early as the Lower Paleolithic period. Its first kingdom was noted in Chinese records in the early 7th century BCE.

Who has the best songbun in North Korea?

In North Korea, one's songbun, or socio-economic and class background, is extremely important and is primarily determined at birth. People with the best songbun are descendants of the anti-Japanese guerrillas who fought with Kim Il-sung, followed by people whose parents or grandparents were factory workers, laborers, or poor, small farmers in 1950.
