

Does CNMI have any fossil fuel resources?

The Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) have no fossil fuel energy resources. The Commonwealth meets nearly all of its energy needs with imported petroleum products. CNMI is about 179 square miles in area, which is collectively about two-and-a-half times the size of Washington, DC.

Which sectors use the most electricity in the Northern Mariana Islands?

The commercial sector, led by tourism, is the largest electricity-consuming sector in the Northern Mariana Islands. 53 CNMI hotels use electricity for air conditioning, water heating, water purification, and lighting.

Where is CNMI located?

The Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) have their population and economic activity concentrated on three islands: Saipan, Tinian, and Rota, which are all located at the southern end of the island chain.

Does CNMI have access to electricity?

CNMI's electric utility generates electricity for the entire population of the territory. In 2022, electricity sales in CNMI were at their highest level since 2017, and the price per kilowatt-hour was at its lowest level since 2016.
